
Butler Livestock Systems formed

Topping the sale was Ester Very Eiline, a 2-year-old consigned by Corbinview Farms, of Reynoldsville. This young cow has records to 19,900 pounds of milk on both her dam and granddam's sides. The sale averaged \$1406 on 33 head sold, with four head selling over \$2000. The directors of the Jefferson County Holstein Club stated their sale average was improved from last year but obviously reflects the current cattle market. The high quality cattle offered for sale were selected from farms in Armstrong, Clarion, and Jefferson counties.
