Companies violate meat act

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Four companies in Pennsylvania, Florida and New Jersey have been sentenced by U.S. District Courts in recent weeks for violating the federal meat inspection law, according to U.S. Department of Agriculture officials. - Pennsylvania: Ray

L. Mummert, owner of spected and passed. Eberly's Meat Market, Yoe, Pa., was fined \$2,500 and placed on two years probation for selling and transporting meat without USDA inspection. Mummert used an official USDA meat stamp to mark uninspected calf carcases as federally in-

Florida: The U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida fined Leshe Ellzy, owner of L-Z International, Inc., Miami, Fla., \$2,000. Ellzy pleaded guilty to knowingly mislabeling and selling beef livers as calf livers. Selling

meat products under a false and misleading name with intent to defraud is a felony.

- Florida: Gurrentz, Glickauf and Oppenheimer, Inc., a brokerage firm in West Palm Beach, Fla., pleaded nolo contendere charges of to mislabeling beef livers and was fined \$250 in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Missouri. USDA compliance officers found a shipment of beef livers that had been relabeled as calf livers.

- New Jersey: The U.S. District Court of Newark, N.J., convicted Frank Atanasio, president of Two Counties Dressed Abattoir, on two misdemeanor counts: failure to destroy condemned lamb and carcasses preparation of those carcasses for use as human food. He was sentenced to two years probation and fined \$1.000.


