

Nest Run Eggs

Prices are from Egg Clearinghouse, Inc., (ECI) Durham, N.H. and reflect trading prices for gradable nest run eggs (GNR) on ECI, a nationwide trading center for producers, packers and marketers. GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. Report supplied by USDA Market Comment: Ready to cook movement on whole birds for immediate shipment is slow and unaggressive. Advance interest has improved in a few quarters, but plants have had to take lower values in order to insure these advanced sales. Parts are ample overall and discounting is fairly widespread today. Overall slaughter is moderate and live supplies are at least adequate. Weights remain lighter than desired in most quarters. Underton is weak.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices are less than on U.S. Grade A at 55-59 cents, with excess loads selling below 50 cents for prompt delivery.


