Ciba-Geigy to build biotech center

GREENSBORO, N.C. - Gov. Jim Hunt, of North Carolina has announced that CIBA-GEIGY, one of the world's largest manufacturers of chemical and agricultural products, will build a \$7 million agricultural biotechnology research center at the Research Triangle Park.

"This center will be one of the first commercial research laboratories in the United States dedicated to agricultural biotechnology, and will establish North Carolina as a leading state for research in this exciting new field," Hunt said in announcing the project.

CIBA-GEIGY officials say the

new center will initially employ up to 58 researchers, technicians and administrative personnel, including a world-class team of biotechnology specialists recruited from around the world.

The center will conduct advanced research in plant molecular biology aimed at developing new products for CIBA-GEIGY's Agricultural Division.
The center will also provide biotechnology research support for CIBA-GEIGY development programs around the world.

The center will be directed by Dr. Mary-Dell Chilton, whose work in plant molecular biology at Washington University in St. Louis

has already won worldwide recognition.

CIBA-GEIGY expects to begin construction of the 40,000 square foot facility in early September, with occupancy scheduled for mid-1984. The facility will include laboratories, administrative offices and greenhouses.


