GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. Live supplies adequate. Weights generally desirable in most quarters. Undertone firm. Today's L.T.L. asking prices .03-.05 higher on U.S. Grade A at 54-58 cents. 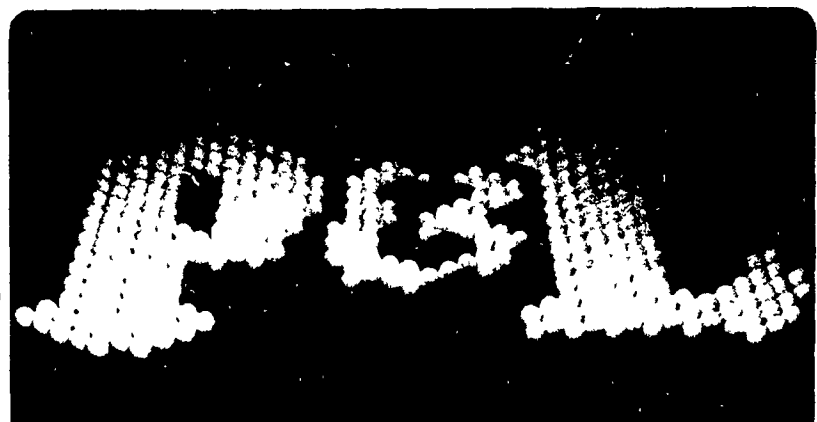
