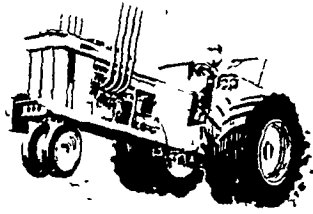

N.J. names dairy winners

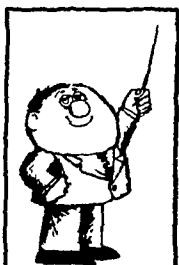

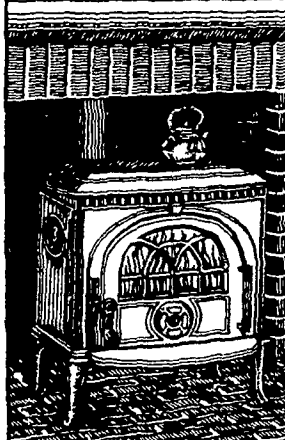

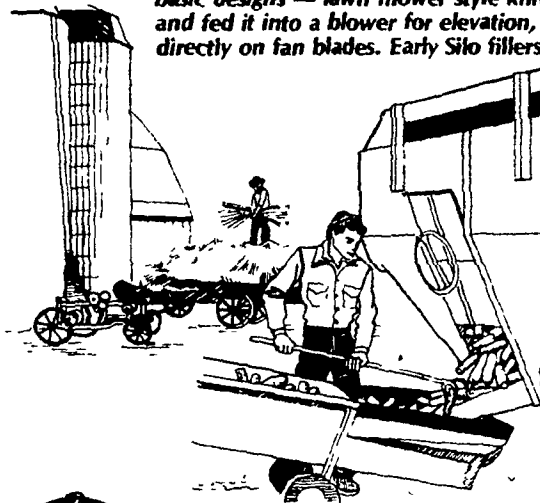

The Tools Of Farming

Silage Machines Number 11 of a Series

At the turn of the century, Silage Machines followed two basic designs — lawn mower style knives that cut the fodder and fed it into a blower for elevation, or knives mounted directly on fan blades. Early Silo fillers were stationary,



powered by single-cylinder gas engines. During the early 1900's, it took 11 men 2 days to fill a 12' x 30' silo. In 1919 Gehl Bros. Co. developed a mobile field machine that revolutionized the industry.

Using modern equipment, 3 men can fill a 20' x 60' silo in one day.

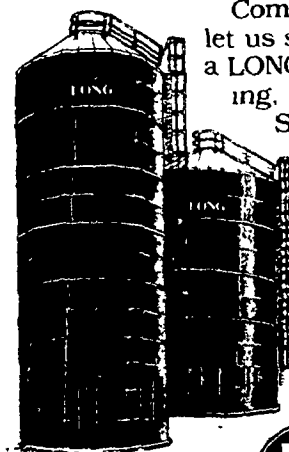
