director of the Bureau of
Agricultural Development,
Pennsylvania Department of
Agriculture
Actual implementation of a

program will be addressed in
"Advanced Marketing Program -
Agricultural and Food Products"
on Tuesday morning at 9:30 a.m.
Self exporting and utilizing the
services provided by export
management and trading com-
panies will be addressed by Ed-
mund Paige, director of the
Eastern U.S. Agriculture and Food
Export Council.

Secretary Hallowell is president
of the Council, which encompasses
11 northeastern states. EUSAFEC
has been instrumental in spon-
soring international food ex-
positions in Atlanta, Ga., and the
U.S. International Food Show set
for New York City in April 1984.

One of the oldest, yet least un-
derstood trading practices is
bartering. The process and role of
bartering in the contemporary
marketplace will be the subject of
John Carpenter, vice president of
International Commodities Export
Corp. He will also discuss com-
modity counter trade.

Moderator for these sessions will
be Dwight Summers, president of
Charles G. Summers, Jr., winner
of the 1981 Governor's Export
Award for Agriculture.

Foreign trade representatives
will be available Tuesday, Oct 4
from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. to discuss
marketing opportunities, sales,
financing, distribution methods
and other specific details of doing
business in their countries. This is
the first time the PITC has offered
such a program.

The Pennsylvania Inter-
national Trade Conference and
the Pennsylvania Department of
Agriculture are two primary
sources of information for those
commonwealth processors and
producers wishing to send their
goods abroad," said Secretary
Hallowell.
