SMETHPORT — The McKean County 4-H Livestock Sale took place recently at the Livestock Show Ring during the McKean County Fair, East Smethport. Some 400 spectators and buyers participated in the sale of 35 animals, consisting of seven steers, 15 market lambs and 13 hogs.

The Grand Champion Market Steer was owned by Doug Comstock, Burtville. The 965-pound

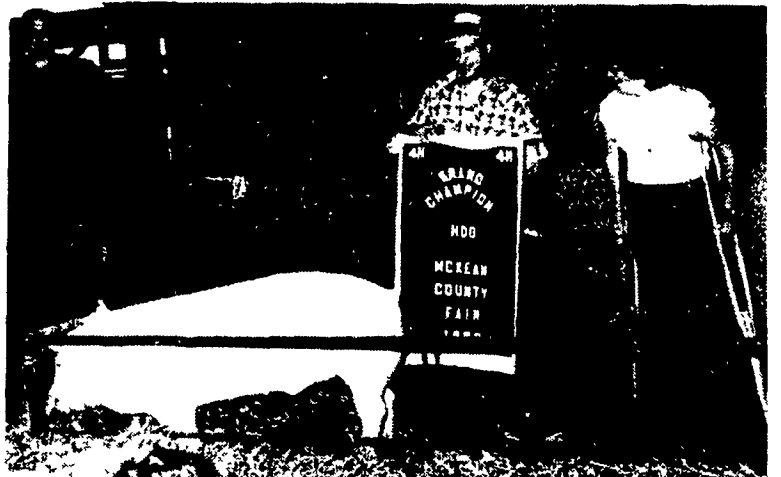
steer was bought by Duffy Inc., East Smethport, for \$1.30 per pound. The Reserve Champion was also owned by Doug. This 1055-pound animal was sold at Hamlin Bank, Smethport, for \$1.05 per pound.

The Grand Champion Market Lamb was owned by Allyson Comes, Smethport. The 115-pound lamb was purchased by Headwaters Production Farm Credit for \$1.75 per pound. The Reserve

Champion was a 90-pound lamb, owned by Rae Ann Kleisath, Smethport, and was sold to Duffy Inc. for \$2 per pound.

The Grand Champion Market Hog was owned by Pam Brown, Port Allegany. It weighed 255 pounds and was purchased by Burleson Agway, Port Allegany, for \$3.10 per pound.
