During the month there were 119 herds with 6,471 cows processed in the DHIA program according to Russell C Seward County Agent. Production ranged from a high of 637 pounds of milk testing 3.9 percent fat to a low of 274 pounds of milk testing 3.4 percent fat.

In the owner sampler program there were 26 herds with 944 cows being processed. The herds ranged from a high of 586 pounds of milk, testing 3.7 percent fat to a low of 364 pounds of milk, testing 2.5 percent fat.

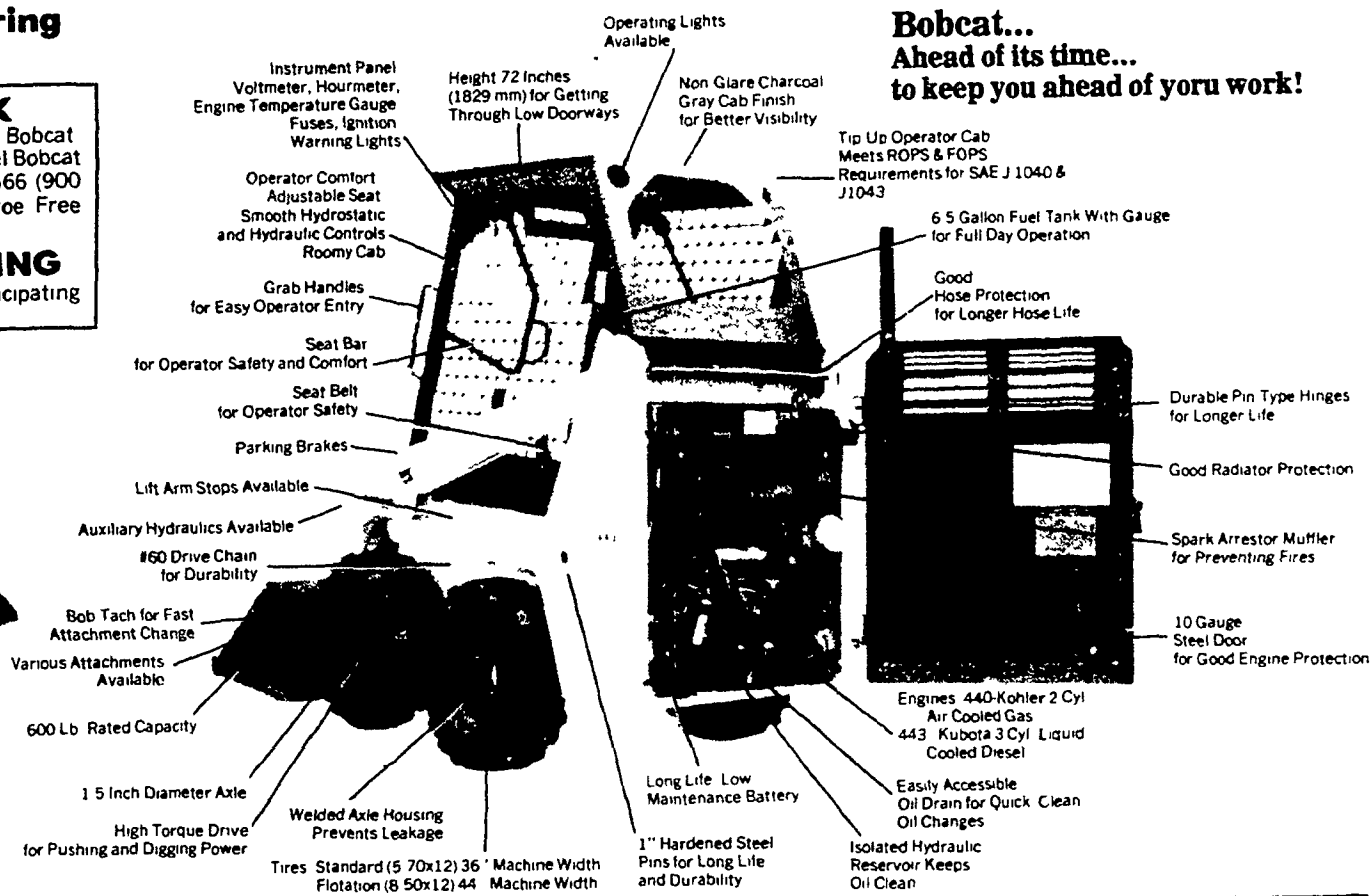
