

NY announces fall schedule of feeder calf sales

PERRY, N.Y. — The fall schedule of feeder calf sales has been announced by the New York Beef Cattlemen's Association.

The sale schedule begins Nov. 5 with sales at opposite ends of the state. The Southwestern Division Sale will be at Angelica and the Eastern Division. Sale at Chatham. About 600 head are expected at the Angelica sale according to sale chairman James Ford, Angelica. The Chatham Sale is expected to have about 300 head

consigned according to sale secretary Claire Barra, Catskill.

A sale for preconditioned calves only will be featured by the Central Division Nov. 11 at Dryden. Sale chairman Ken Swan of Whitney Point said a minimum number of consignments has been established in order to have this specialized sale.

Such preconditioned calves eligible for the Nov. 11 sale must have been weaned 30 days prior to the date and fed roughage in a

bunklike feeder and watered from a mechanical source at least 30 days prior to the sale. Certificates of vaccination for IBR, PL3, and Pasturella not less than 21 days or more than 30 days prior to the sale are required to meet preconditioning guidelines.

Preconditioned calves are often more acceptable to feedlot buyers and often command a higher price than "green calves". While preconditioned calves will be accepted and given special

identification at all the Cattlemen's Association sponsored sales, the Dryden Sale, Nov. 11, is designed especially for preconditioned calves as a means of attracting volume buyers.

The Southern Tier Division Sale will be Nov. 12 at Bath and 500 head are expected according to Al Cisco, Lindley, sale chairman.

The Western Division Sale Nov. 19 at Caledonia will feature 550 consignments according to William Frost, Holcomb, sale chairman.

A final Wind-up Sale Dec. 10 has been scheduled at Dryden to meet the marketing needs of those cattlemen who were unable to wean their calves early. Information about this sale may be obtained from Ken Swan, Whitney Point.

The feeder calf sales are a major

marketing emphasis of the New York Beef Cattlemen's Association and are held across the state to encourage greater consignor and buyer participation.

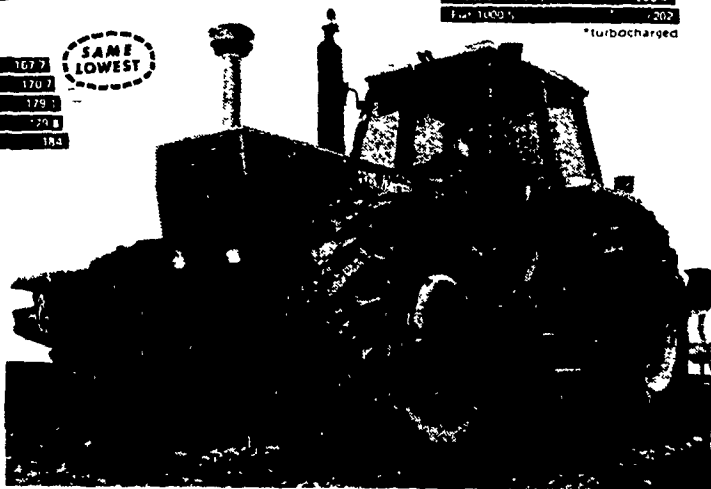
