After the juniors of each association concluded their business meeting, they met upstairs to enjoy pizza and an old-fashioned hoedown.

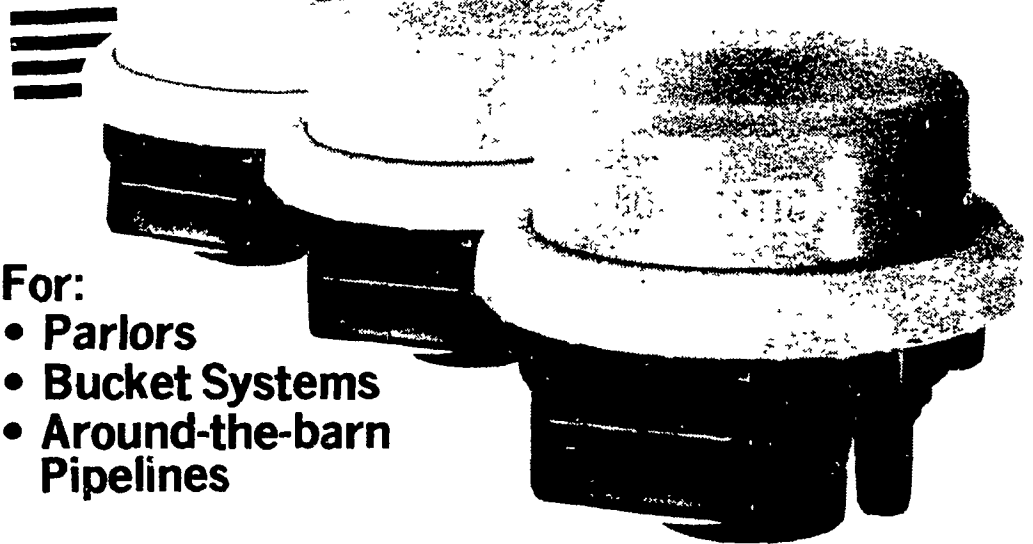
