GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. Market Comment. Ready to cook movement on whole birds is noted as fairly good in most all quarters with clearances now satisfactory overall. Advance interest is also fairly good as retail features and first of month business are expected to generate much better orders. Parts are moving a little better but supplies overall are fully adequate with wings in the longest position. Slaughter schedules are moderate. Live supplies are adequate to fully adequate. Weights improved but still heavier than desired for the store in total. Undertone is generally steady.

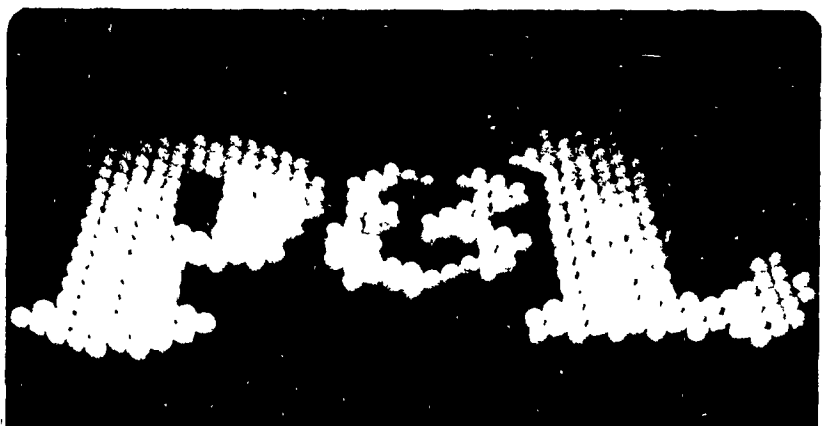
