# Teaching handicapped to ride

NEWARK, Del. - When you're sitting tall in the saddle, everything looks smaller-even your troubles. At least that's the way it seemed to a group of handicapped youngsters taught to ride by 4-H leader Katherine B. Inglee. her daughter Elizabeth, and other 4-H members.

The youngsters, who suffer from autism, epilepsy, Downes' syn-

drome and cerebral palsy, were hesitant at first, but Mrs. Inglee and her 4-H'ers urged them on with gentle patience. Often four or more members worked with a single handicapped rider, leading the horse and lending physical support on all sides.

The mounts were all 4-H project horses cared for by members. Not a range of disabilities including many horses are suitable for this type of duty. Horses for the han-

dicapped must respond slowly, and must not be afraid of wheelchairs. Many horses fear bicycles, and this fear usually carries over to wheelchairs.

A special bond was formed among Mrs. Inglee, the 4-H'ers, the handicapped riders and their gentle steeds. Eventually the project had to be disbanded because of insurance considerations, but the leader is

different stable.

As a result of her efforts, Mrs. Inglee has been selected to represent Delaware at a national 4-H volunteer leaders' forum on bringing the disabled into 4-H. She'll be at the National 4-H Center in Washington, D.C. from October

The conference, sponsored by the E. Matilda Ziegler Foundation for the Blind, Inc. and the Dr. Scholl Foundation, will include

taking steps to start it again at a information on pet therapy, horticultural therapy, and mainstreaming the disabled into regular 4-H activities Special sessions will focus on communicating with the handicapped, relating to teens, and legislative issues of concern to disabled persons.


Field trips will take advantage of the resources of the national capital area, with visits to such places as the Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Lab and Gallaudet College


