PENNSYLVANIA MARKETS

TOBACCO GROWERS

If you want to sell your tobacco to go south, do not strip before rib is dryed down real good. Do not strip as damp as you were used to doing in PA if you want a good market now and in the future. Do not handle or strip on real damp days, that is a good day to take off or do your other work, you have time all winter. Do not use your tobacco cellar or if you do make sure you get it out the next day. This tobacco heats quicker and we do not want it to heat at all. If you have some that gets too damp hang it out in the wind. If you put it in bales too damp it's almost impossible to dry again and the leaves bake together too hard. It should rattle, rattle, rattle. A good rule of thumb is if you hold a handful of stripped tobacco upside down in your hand, the leaves should stand up. If they bend over it's too damp to bale.

Throw all green out with the stalks where it belongs. Green greatly reduces the quality of your crop as it makes it bitter. Make your bales the Tenn. size, 12 inches wide, 22 inches high, 35 inches long. If you do not have a Tenn. box you can use your old one by using 2 pieces of 1 inch plywood cut 35 inches long and about 32 inches high, nail inside your box, make your chains a little longer and cut 1 inch off each side of lid, use cotton twine, 3 ropes (not 4), no paper, bales should weigh 55 to 65 lbs. Follow this and if one Company rejects your tobacco the next will buy. If you get a good offer consider selling part crop, it might get better.

PS - Cut this out and put in a plastic bag and hang in your stripping room as a reminder.

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
