
Kennard-Dale team places 2nd

Chapters earn the award for their activities in 11 areas of a chapter's program of work. These areas include: supervised agricultural experience; cooperation; community service; leadership; earnings, savings, and investments; conduct of meetings; scholarship; recreation; public relations; state and national activities; and Alumni relations.

Many chapters were involved in community activities such as the distribution of agricultural facts to the public, chemical can crushing services, maintenance of school ball diamonds, landscaping, and installation of street signs.
