

## Bull tops Guernsey sale

LANCASTER — A five month old bull calf, Clearbranch B T Topaz, topped the 57th Renewal Sale and Pennsylvania State Sale, October 13, at the Guernsey Sale Pavillion. Topaz brought \$6000 from his buyers, Eastern Breeders Inc., United Breeders Inc., and Western Ontario Breeders Inc., of Woodstock, Ontario.

Topaz was consigned by H. J. Haga of Fort Valley, Georgia. His sire is T H Big Tex. His dam, McDonalds Darimost Jean, is a Gold Star dam with a cow index of +1407M +.10% +78F +\$232. She

was sold in 1979 for \$30,000.

Second high seller in the sale, Clearbranch Jeans N P Satin, was also consigned by H. J. Haga. Satin was purchased by Anchor and Hope Farms of Port Deposit, Md. for \$4000.

Satin is a bred heifer due to calf in May to Clovelly Top Hornet. She is sired by Kellogg Nances Prince. Her dam is also McDonalds Darimost Jean.
