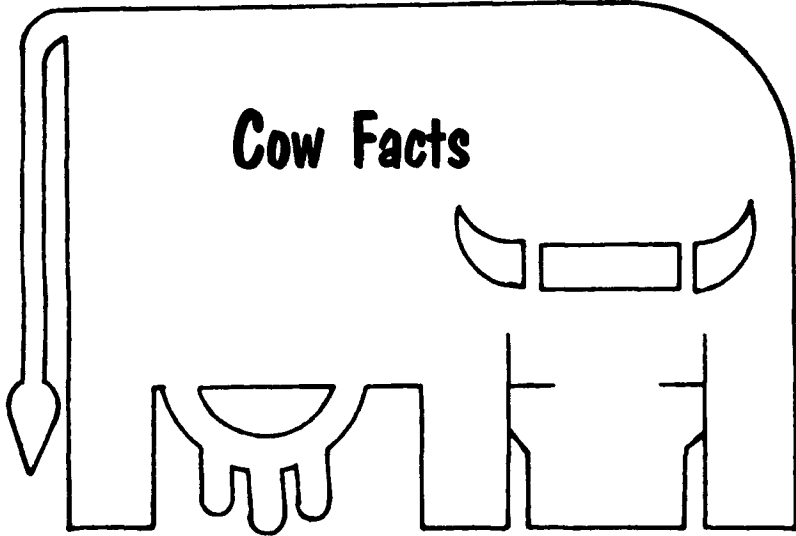
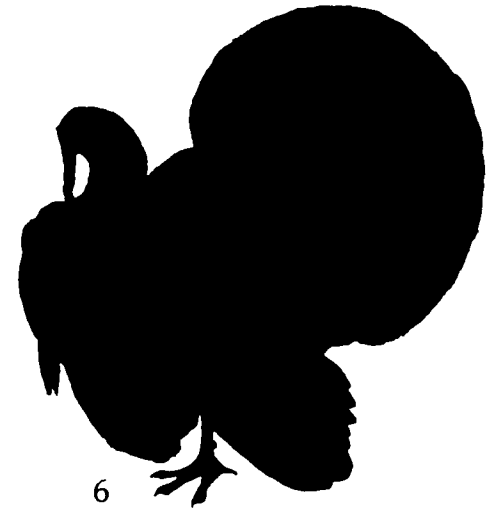
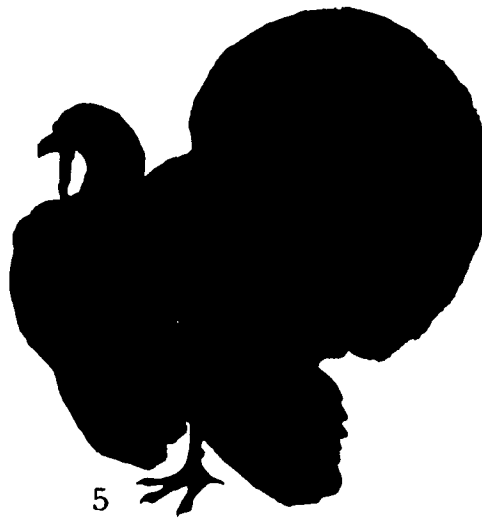
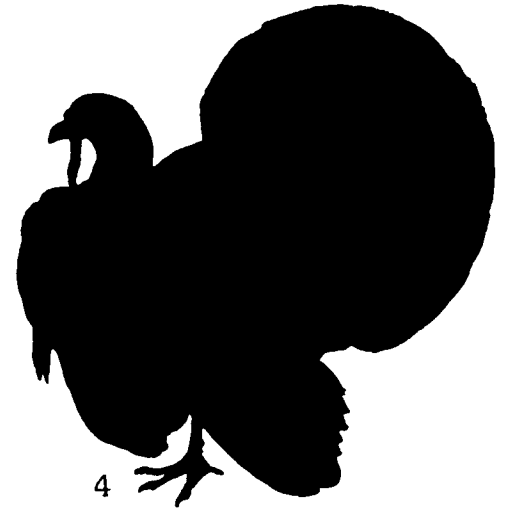
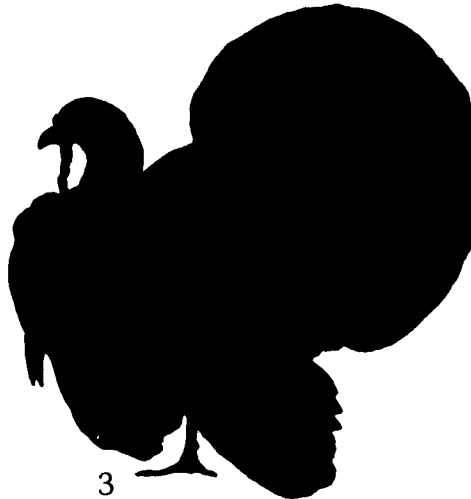
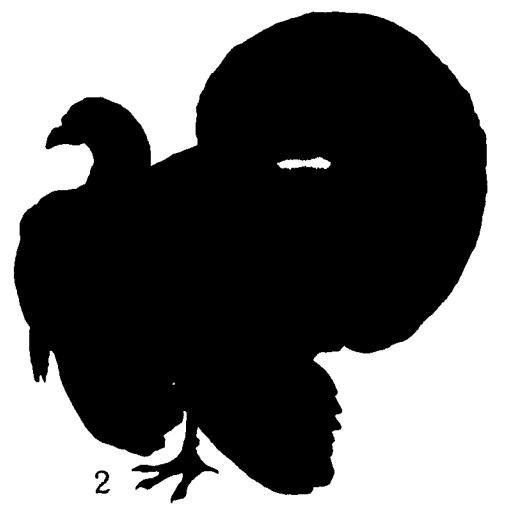


Find the Shadow

Here are three facts about cows. Try stumping your friends with them. But first, see if you can guess the right answers.

Which state in the United States produces the most milk each year? Hint: It's not Alaska.

A cow in Indiana set a record in 1975. She gave more milk in one day than any other cow ever has. How many quarts of milk did she produce?

(Wisconsin is the winner. But if you said: "States don't produce milk, cows do," give yourself a gold star.)

(If you said around 100 quarts, that's close enough. Actually, it was 155½ pounds of milk. A quart weighs about 2.1 pounds. The average for a really good cow is 65 pounds — about 30 quarts. Imagine how tired that prize-winning cow must have been after her record-producing day!)

How many glasses of milk does the average cow produce in a day?

(65 glasses!)

Answer: Number 4.
