Leg and leg quarters are fully adequate, but movement is mixed as some note a slightly better movement while other still find the demand slow. Wings move well even at the higher price

Overall slaughter is light as a couple of plants are not operating today. Live supplies are adequate. Weights irregular but are now desirable at most plants. Undertone steady.


