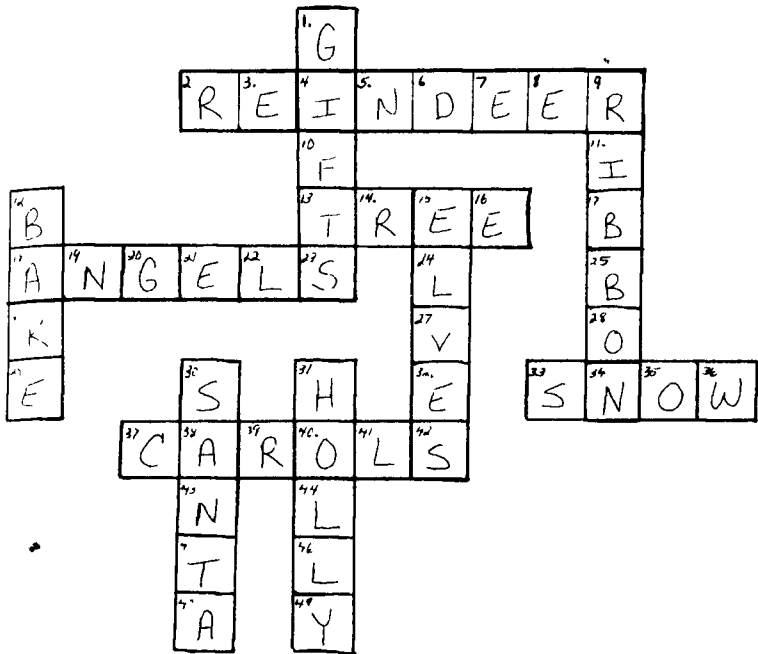


Answers to puzzle

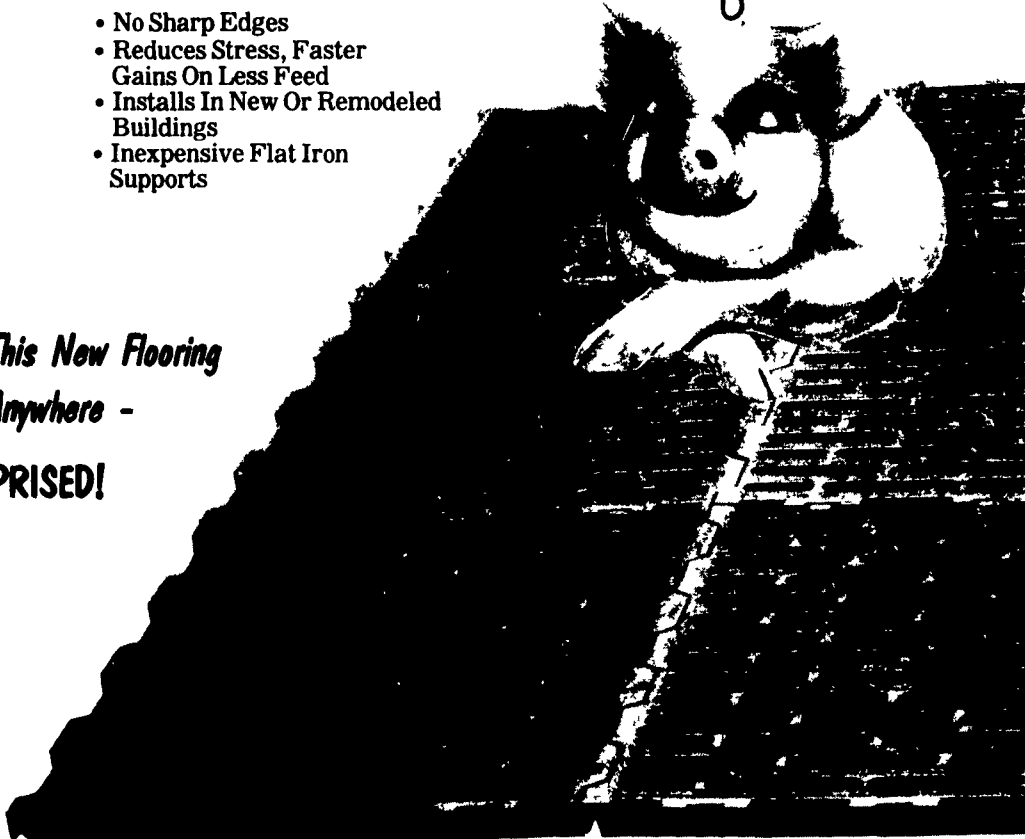
