In other activities, he is a member of the Bowmansville (Turn to Page D13)

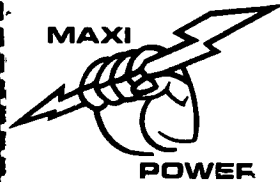

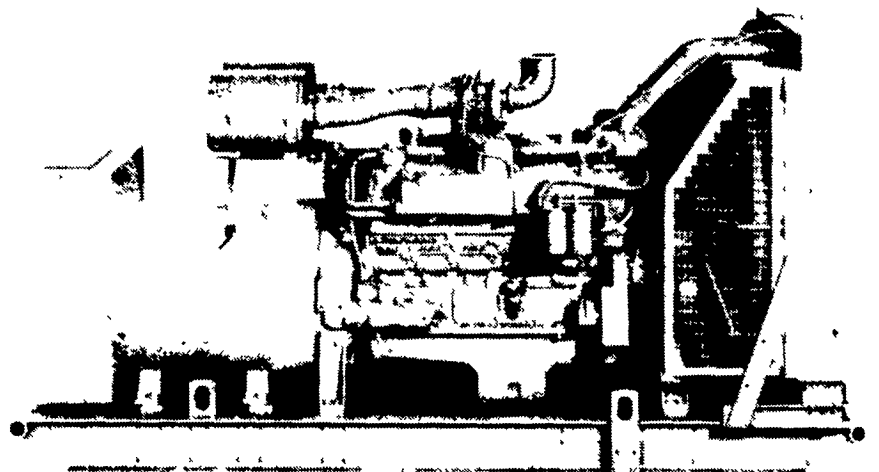

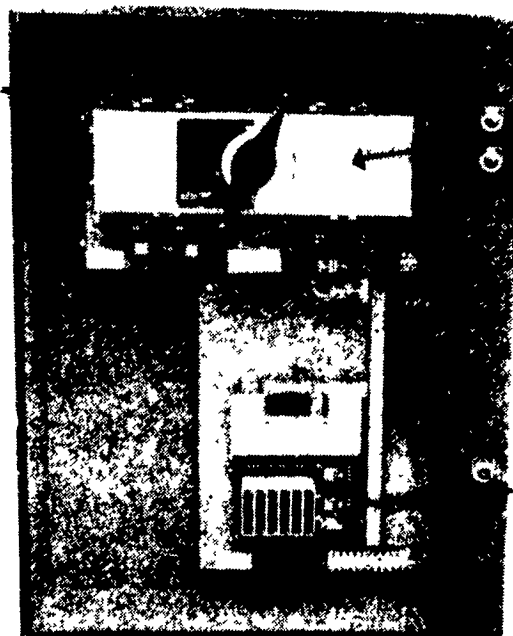
