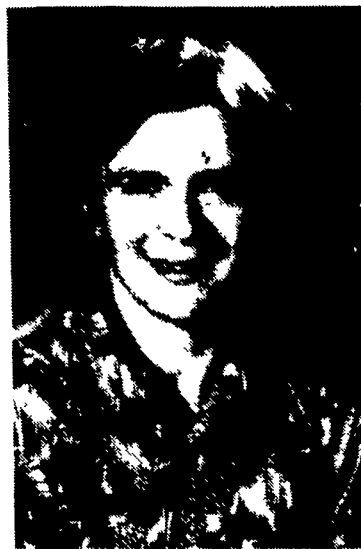


FFA'ers to gather for mid-winter convention

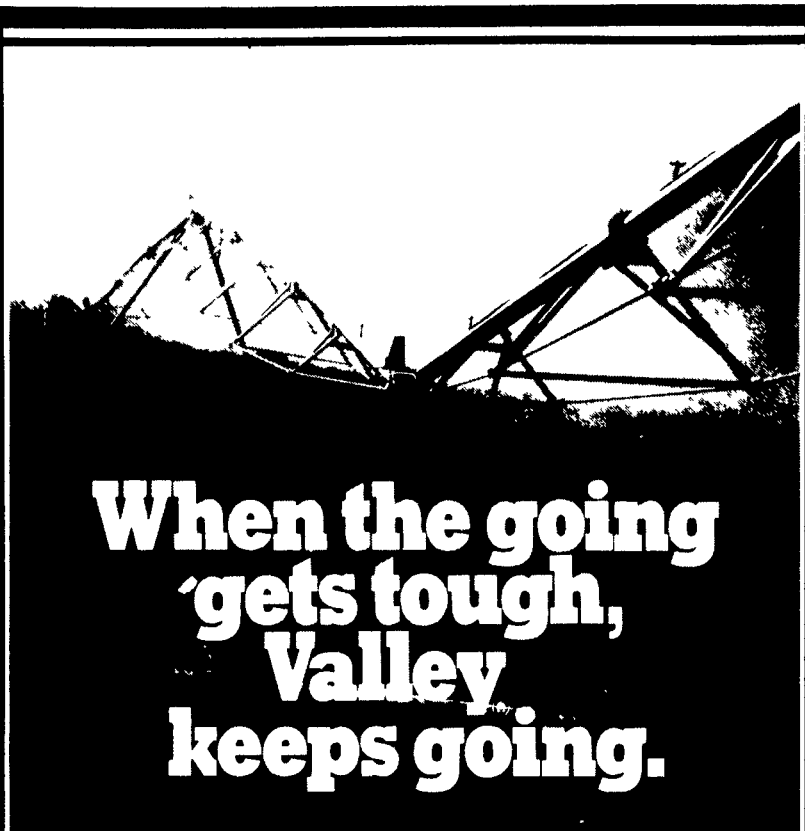
