# Northern Lebanon County ag honors its own J.R.

MT ZION — Northern Lebanon County agriculture has had its own "J.R." for more than a quarter century and its farming community turned out in force Thursday night to honor him as an educator, leader and motivator of youth.

While to TV viewers, J.R. represents a ruthless Texas millionaire, the man in Northern Lebanon – better know as J. Ray – is just the opposite. He's a man who has guided a couple of generations of farm youth from their days as energetic, aimless Greenhands in FFA to their present position as productive farmers and community leaders in the area described as "on the upper side of Rt. 422."

And in the long run, J. Ray is more wealthy beyond imagination in terms of the farming friendships he has achieved during his long tenure of service to the ag community.

The man, of course, is J. Ray Bickel, recently retired vo-ag teacher, FFA and Young Farmer advisor in the Northern Lebanon School District.

Former teachers, students, colleagues, community leaders and a whole bunch of friends turned out Thursday night at the Mt. Zion Social Hall to pay tribute to this man whose better known nickname is "Mr. FFA."

And what did these people have to say about J. Ray:

Harvey Smith, Area vo-ag consultant - "He has been the father of competition among FFA'ers in Lebanon County. But his contributions stretch far beyond the county. He has helped

bring more Gold Emblems back to the Northern FFA Chapter than any chapter in the state."

Clarence Krammes,, former Northern Lebanon principal – "He's many things – motorcyclist, boat enthusiast, water skiler and grower of strawberries and blueberries. But most of all he has been an educator who motivated students to do their best."

Leory Gessaman, president of the Pennsylvania Young Farmers--"J. Ray is a good coaxer and my standing up here tonight is testament to that."

Clarence Manbeck, former state senator and poultry industry leader: "He is among those men who is honored not only for what he has brought out in himself, but what he has brought out in others."

Dean Patches, representing FFA, Young Farmers and FFA Alumni: "I know from experience what a good pusher and motivator he is. He knew how to put the energy of youth to good use."

Carl Wenger, of Myerstown: "As a father of FFA'ers in ELCO for the past 20 years, I can attest to the competitive spirit he brought to FFA in Lebanon County."

And there were even some lighthearted moments of tribute. The only area man in ag who could realistically play the part, Guy Braxton, now an ag consultant, portrayed "Mr. T." of the A-Team

and paid tribute to one particular area of FFA activities in which J. Ray has become legend – bringing home county and state parliamentary procedure championships.

And, finally, the man who everyone came to honor reminisced a bit from his career that had its start as a navigator in a World War II B-24, to being a veterans instructor and finally in vo-ag at Northern Lebanon.

He summed up his career philosophy in a few words:

"It's so good to see so many FFA'ers and Young Farmers here who have taken their place as leaders in the community."



"Helping to develop leadership and citizenship – that's what it has all been about."


