Berks Society 6

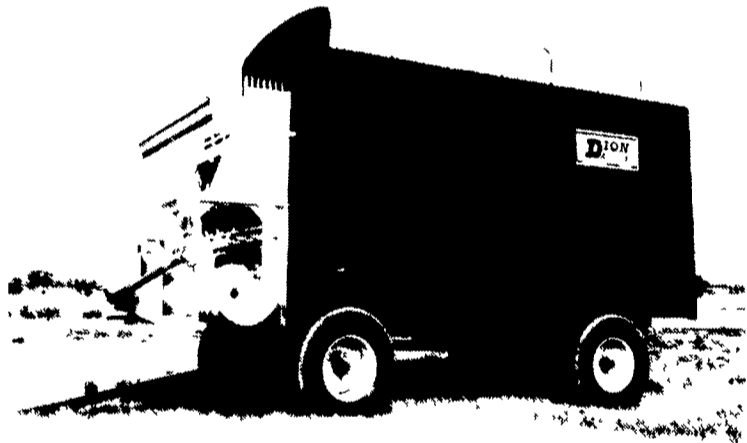
