These figures represent sales of 13 representative growers, packers and shippers.

This promotion has the potential to move a large quantity of 12/3 bagged apples. The Board's Marketing Representative, Kay Swartz, has been contacting the buyers from independent stores as well as from the major chains in Pennsylvania and reports getting favorable results from these contacts. 
