GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. Market Comment: Ready to cook movement on whole birds is fair. Processors indicated that regular customers were taking their normal commitments, but any excess products were difficult to move. Wings are well-cleared. Breasts and cutlets are moving quite satisfactorily while legs and leg quarters are slow to clear despite lower price levels. Slaughter is moderate overall. Live supplies are light to adequate. Weights are lighter than desired to occasionally desirable. Undertone is steady at best.

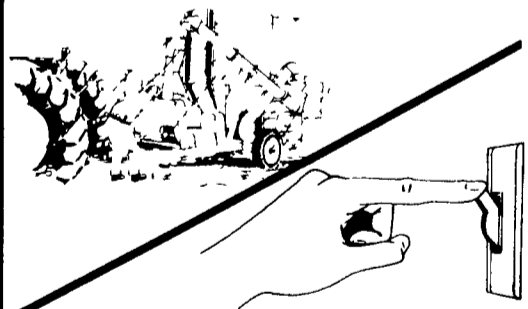
