

# Sheetz gets ag posts

HARRISBURG - Rep. Terry Scheetz of Lancaster County, has been named to two special statewide committees that will study ag issues.

The 99th District lawmaker has recently asked to serve on separate panels to study the avian flu epidemic and preservation of the Chesapeake Bay.

Scheetz was appointed by House Speaker K. Leroy Irvis to a 17member bipartisan select committee to investigate the effects of avian influenza and make recommendations to revitalize the affected poultry industry.

"The select committee is ex-


pected to look into the immediate and long-range effects of the disease on the poultry industry and associated businesses," explained Scheetz. "The panel has also been directed to formulate a plan to aid the recovery of the industry and businesses and individuals that have been adversely affected by the epidemic."

Scheetz said the select committee was created by a House resolution (HR 169) which called for the panel to report its findings to the full House within three months.

Meanwhile, Scheetz was asked by the state Agriculture Department to serve in a working group designed to prevent nutrient runoff into the Chesapeake Bay's watershed. Specifically, the panel will develop financial assistance recommendations to help farmers to reduce such runoff.

'It takes time and money for farmers to reduce nutrient runoff into streams and rivers," said Scheetz. "This committee will have to find ways to make such resources available.'
