are covered: asparagus, beans, beets, carrots, celery, crucifers (cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, brussels sprouts and turnip), cucurbits (cucumber, muskmelon, cantaloupe, watermelon, squash and pumpkin), eggplant, lettuce, onions, parsnips, peas, peppers, radishes, spinach, sweet corn, sweet potatoes and tomatoes.
