Digital instrumentation cluster is a standard feature on new Case 94 Series over 100 horsepower two- and four-wheel-drive tractors.

RACINE, WI. - Sophisticated electronics on the new J I Case 94 Series agricultural tractors provide monitoring of critical functions and accurate field performance data.

The new electronic digital instrumentation cluster — the only one of its kind now available in the industry as a standard feature — is featured on Case 94 Series over-100 hp two- and four-wheel-drive agricultural tractors.

The digital instrumentation cluster allows an operator to precisely measure tractor performance, including engine rpm, PTO speed, ground speed, area worked per hour and total area worked. With an optional true ground speed sensor, the percentage of wheel slippage can be accurately and constantly measured. Using this information, farmers can control the application of field chemicals or plant population more precisely.

Monitoring percentage of wheel slippage helps an operator better determine distribution of tractor ballast for increased field efficiency.

Thirteen different indicators visually and audibly monitor operating functions such as engine oil pressure and temperature, transmission oil pressure and temperature, exhaust gas temperature, coolant temperature and level, alternator voltage and fuel level. An inexpensive option provides for automatic engine shutdown when malfunctions of vital systems approach the critical stage.

Case engineers consider the ability to determine ground speed the single most important function of the new 94 Series electronics.

"By knowing true ground speed, an operator can more precisely select operating gears for improved field efficiency," says George Mueller, J.I. Case project engineer — electronics. "This knowledge also allows the farmer to more accurately determine the amount of chemicals that should be applied to a given area regardless of wheel slippage, engine rpm, soil conditions or tire selection."
