## **Bergland to speak Friday**

CAMP HILL - Former U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Bob Bergland will be the guest speaker at the fourth annual statewide fundraising dinner for FARMER. the political action committee of the Pennsylvania Farmers' Association (PFA).

The fundraising dinner will be held at the Holiday Inn - Center City, Harrisburg, Friday, starting at 6 p.m. FARMER (Farmers Allied for Responsive More Effective Representation) is a voluntary, bi-partisan organization dedicated to electing and keeping frields of agriculture in the General Assembly.

Bergland, who served as U.S. Agriculture Secretary under President Jimmy Carter, is slated to become the new chief executive officer of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) next month.

A former Minnesota farmer, Bergland became chairman of that state's ASCS in 1961 and moved to Washington D.C. two years later to become Midwest Area Director for ASCS. He was elected to Congress representing his home state's 7th Congressional District in 1970 and served in the U.S. House until he was picked to head USDA in 1977.

During his administration, the

Farmer-Owned Grain Reserve was established to help stabilize prices and increase farmers' marketing options. In 1979, Secretary Bergland instituted a major study into changes affecting agriculture since World War II. Known as the "Structure of Agriculture" report, it set an agenda of goals to be pursued in American agriculture in the future.


Prior to his selection for the NRECA post, Bergland had served as President of the Farmland World Trade, a subsidiary of Farmland Industries, the nation's farmer-cooperative, largest headquartered in Kansas City, Mo. In this position he traveled extensively to develop long-term farm markets.


Tickets for the FARMER fundraiser are available from PFA. The cost is \$100 per person; \$130 including spouse.
