

The balance of items is clearing reasonably well under a fair demand.

Slaughter schedules are moderately heavy. Live supplies are adequate. Weights are desireable in most quarters. Undertone is generally steady.

GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week.
