They "shopped" for hours in order to find the particular tablecloth that they wanted I footh left them; found a taxi and went back to the ship by myself where I was able to get a few hours of sun by the pool before dinner

At 11 p.m. all the passangers were invited to the Continental dining room to view and take pictures of a lavish display of very fancy dishes and ice sculptures. If we had waited until midnight, we were invited to eat the picturesque food spread on long tables. However since I felt that I was fed well enough, I skipped the food and went to bed.




