

Traditional quilt patterns don't have to be limited to pieced-together fabrics for beddings and throw pillows. The patterns can easily be duplicated in stitchery for any number of projects.

The country quilt coasters shown here, for example, feature "star quilt" patterns on plastic canvas. Beginning or advanced needleworkers can embroider the patterns, yet the results are sophisticated enough for any decorating scheme.

To make two 3-by-3-inch coasters, kits are available by writing to the address below. Further information about stitching your own star patterns follows.

Star quilt patterns have been popular for generations. Designs like the ones shown here were invented in colonial times and handed down from mother to daughter to needleworkers today.

Star patterns were often inspired by the stars in the heavens, but many other objects inspired the patterns as well. Some hardly seem star-shaped, as indicated by their names.

According to the "Illustrated Index to Traditional American Quilt Patterns" (Arco Publishers), star patterns include Dove at the Window, Flying Saucer, Hopscotch, Formosa Tea Leaf, Chips and Whetstones, Mariner's Compass and Mexican Rose. The

patterns range from simple to intricate, but all show a perfect balance of shape and color

Because colonial quilt makers didn't always limit the number, shapes and sizes of the pieces in a pattern, some star patterns are difficult to piece together into quilts. On plastic canvas, however, any pattern is fast and easy to stitch.

Here are directions for stitching star quilt patterns on plastic canvas:


MATERIALS: Coaster kit; or plastic-point squares, yarns, tapestry needle, scissors, design chart or graph paper and pencil.

DESIGN: 1. Either use a design chart, or draw your own design on graph paper. 2. For your own design: Copy a star shown here, take a design from a traditional quilt book, or invent your own star quilt pattern.

pur chart, work star points, corners and border blocks in the satin stitch. 2. Work outlines in the continental stitch. 3. Work background in the continental stitch. 4. Overcast edges.

SATIN STITCH: 1. Work stitches parallel, either in straight lines or diagonally, according to your preference. 2. Stitch straight lines over as many meshes as needed, from one side of the design to the other (a).

CONTIENTAL STITCH: 1.




Begin at upper right-hand corner.
2. Work stitches from right to left according to illustration (b). 3.
Turn canvas upside down to stitch the next row, again working from right to left.
