Market Comment: Movement on ready to cook whole birds is slightly improved today, but still remains on the light side. Additional products remain available but not to the extent of earlier in the week. Breasts and cutlets are clearing reasonably well. Other items are easily available but a slightly improved inquiry was noted for weekend arrivals.

Overall slaughter is light as an occasional plant is not operating or has cut back on the kill. Live supplies are adequate at generally desirable weights.
