Luttringer also announced the final plans for the second week option of a trip to Scotland. The Scotland trip will include six days

and six nights, leaving Derby and traveling to the lake region of Scotland. Visits to Glasgow and Edinburgh as well as a visit to Loch Lomand are included.

Travelers will return to England through York, and will have a day of leisure in London before returning with the group to the United States.

Total cost of this option is \$260 for double occupancy or \$330 for single occupancy, including hotel lodging and 10 meals.

Each ambassador will live with a host family for the first week, and have the option of staying with a host for the second week, taking

the organized trip to Scotland or traveling on their own. A third week of independent travel has been included as an option in this Exchange.

The cost of the Exchange to England has been established at \$635, including ground transportation to and from Philadelphia and to and from Derby to London.

Applications for hosts for the England exchange with Lancaster County from May 23 to June 5 will continue to be accepted, with actual host assignments depending upon the total number of ambassadors visiting from England. An orientation meeting for host families will be held in another month, according to Leo Shelly, who is in charge of workshops for both hosts and ambassadors.

Tractor safety course offered

NORRISTOWN - The Montgomery County Extension Service and the 4-H clubs will offer a tractor safety certification course for area youth. Under the Fair Labor Standards Act, all 14 or 15 year olds who plan to be employed off the home farm and who will be involved in operating a tractor of over 20 PTO horse power, must have completed such a course before they can be employed.

The course will begin on April 10th from 7-9 p.m. and continue for three consecutive Tuesday nights up to and including May 1st. A driving test will be held Saturday, May 5th in the morning.

Classes will be held at the Western Montgomery Vo-Tech School in Limerick. Roger Michelone of Green Lane will be the instructor. Some previous driving experience is desirable.

Although the course is geared to 14- and 15-year-olds, anyone interested in learning about basic tractor safety is welcome to attend. Parents are also invited to sit in on the classes.
