

Spring Judging Contest today at Penn State

UNIVERSITY FAIR
Preparations are under way for the 67th Little International Livestock Exposition to be held this Spring at The Pennsylvania State University. The event is a highlight of the school year for members of the Block and Bridle Club.

The exposition begins today with the 11th Annual Spring Judging Contest at 9 a.m. at the Penn State Beef and Sheep Center. Youth in 4-H and FFA, and collegiate amateurs and professionals will

demonstrate their skills in livestock by judging beef cattle, sheep and swine. The senior 4-H and FFA and the collegiate professional divisions will give oral reasons as well as class placings.

Judy A. Long of Carlisle, senior in agricultural economics and rural sociology, will be chairman of the contest with Nelson R. Beam of Elverson, junior in animal production, as her assistant. Dr. Erskine H. Cash of the Department of Dairy and Animal Science will serve as faculty advisor. The cost

of a bag lunch will be included in the registration fee.

Show Day for the 67th Little International will be held at the University's Beef and Sheep Center at 8 a.m. on April 21. Five weeks before the exposition

students draw lots for their animals and begin many hours of preparation. Competition consists of fitting and showing beef cattle, horses, sheep, and swine.

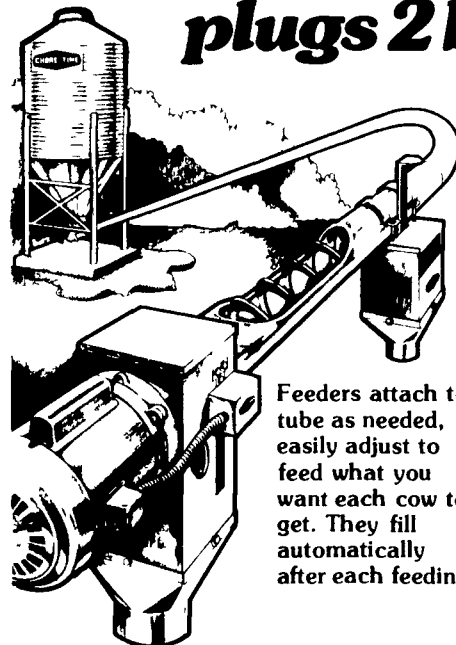

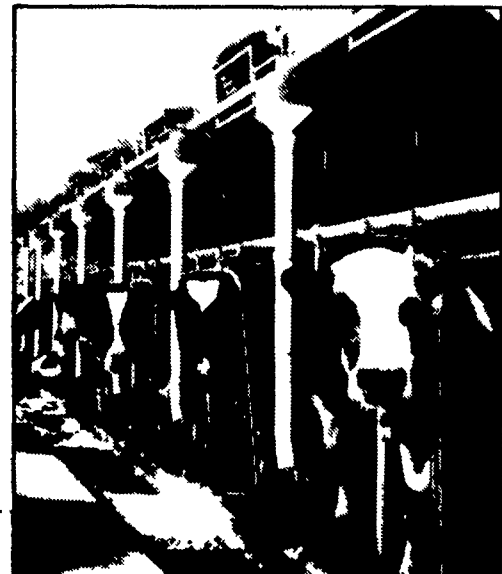

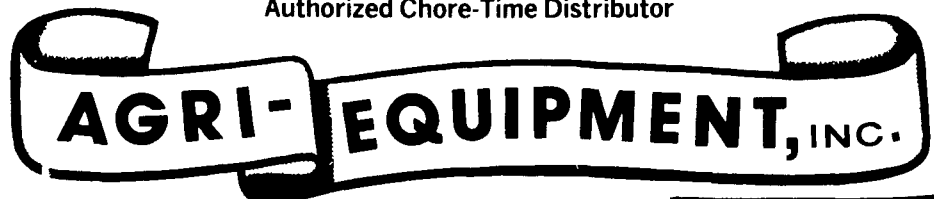
