present Diane Brown, regional program leader in family living for the Penn State Cooperative Extension Service. Her program will be "Women and Money Management."

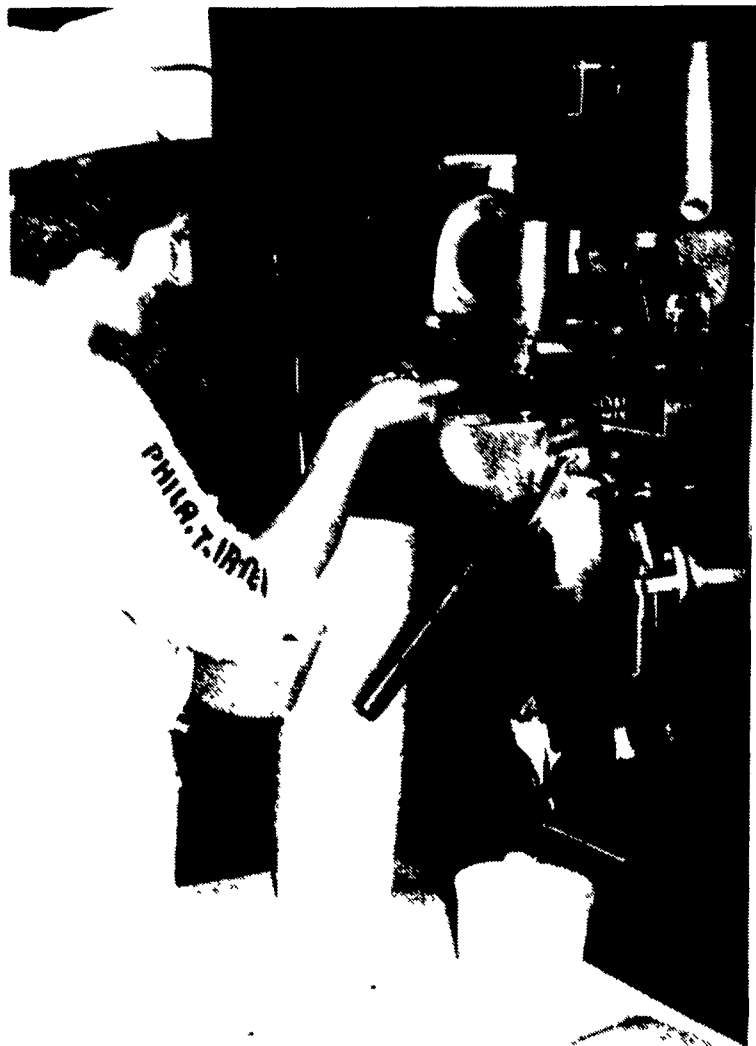
Joyce E. Hershey, editor of the Chester County Cookbook and a farmer's wife, will talk about the "The Bounty of Chester County."

cookie before it is rushed off to the freezer.

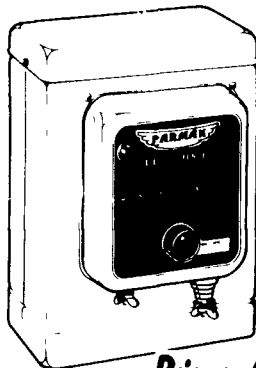
The temptation to taste is a hard one to resist, Deb and Connie admit.
