year, then do it now. Also, if you notice any changes in your water, such as an off-color, an unusual flavor or even an odor then be sure to have it tested immediately. Remember, these samples should be taken to the lab in either a container provided by the lab or a sterilized bottle.

To Check Alarm Systems

Many farms have alarm systems, and unless they are tested regularly to determine that they will function immediately in an emergency, they can create a false sense of security. It is important to use a test record form. It should contain columns for entering the date of the test, initials of persons performing the test, and comments. An alarm system should be tested at a specific time, at least once a week. The complete forms should be filed for insurance purposes. If the system is not designed to operate under farm

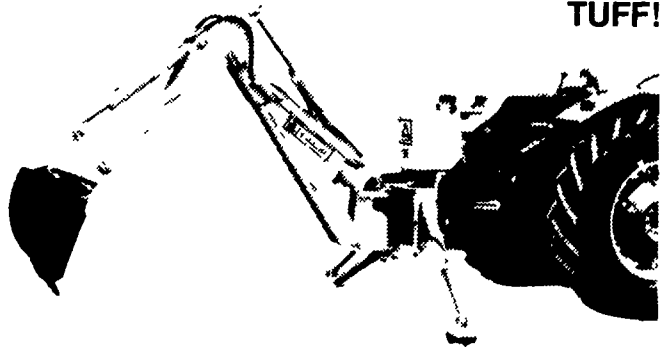

The sections may be dismantled and relocated. Customers may select any length or width in 5' 2" increments.

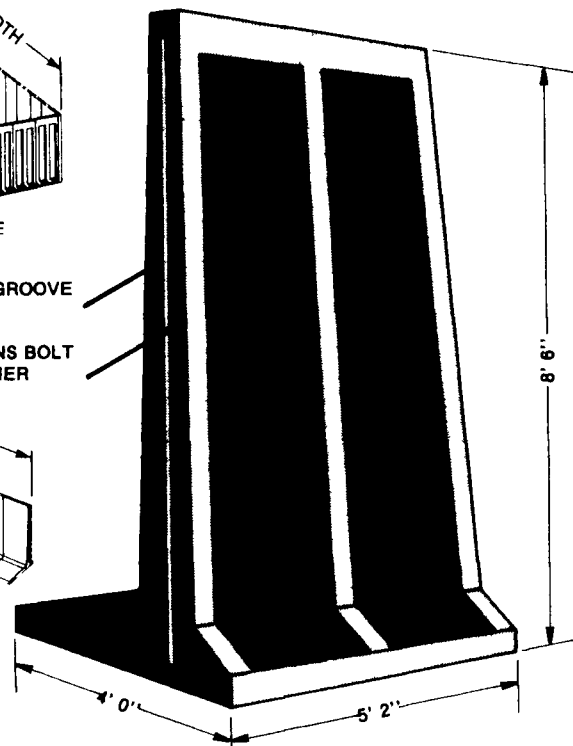
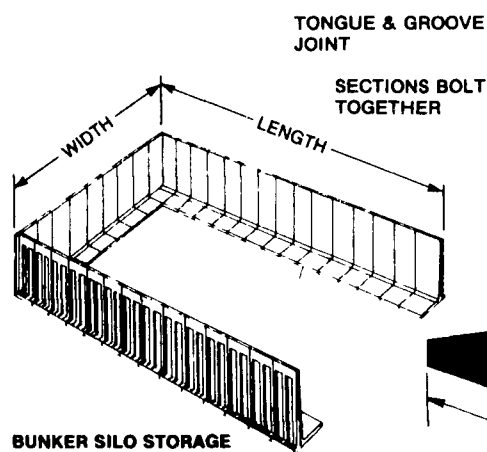
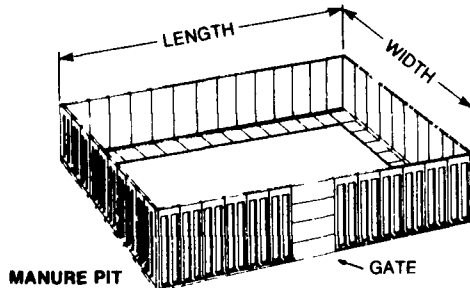
A special center wall is available to permit placing bunker silos side by side or dividing existing trench silos.
