

Report supplied by USDA MARKET COMMENT: Prices unchanged. Cartoned egg movements is good. Floor stocks remain heavy in preparation for the holiday. Seller offerings of the heavier weight eggs remain limited and firmly held. However, the buying interest is not as aggressive as before, and dealers only buy if really needed and not just to have extra stocks on hand. Mediums and smalls are a little more available and adequate in most quarters. Undertone steady to occasionally firm.
