PFA hails fruit, vegetable legislation

CAMP HILL - The Pennsylvania Farmers' Association (PFA) has hailed a major, legislative victory for fruit and vegetable producers which will enable them to recover an estimated \$64 million lost every year on payment due for produce sold to produce buyers who are insolvent or go bankrupt.

Congress approved an amendment to the Perishable Agricultural Commodities Act (PACA), last week, which will require produce buyers to maintain enough assets in a statutory trust to cover their obligations to produce sellers. The legislation is now awaiting President Reagan's signature.

PFA president Keith Eckel of Lackawanna County, himself a vegetable producer and dairyman, said, "This much-needed reform takes an unnecessary risk out of the business of growing fruits and vegetables. It will help produce sellers like myself collect from a buyer who is slow in making payments or who fails to come up with the rightful payment.'

Eckel represented PFA and is nationwide affiliate, the American Farm Bureau Federation, in supporting the PACA amendment in testimony last November before House and Senate agriculture subcommittees.

During that testimony Eckel noted that even though PACA presently requires payment to sellers within 10 days of sale, payments from buyers have been slowing down in recent years. According to Produce Reporter Co., a credit agency for the industry, the number of cases in which buyers pay for produce within 10 days has declined during the last seven years from 55 per-

cent to 31 percent. Conversely, the instances in which buyers pay for produce more than 30 days after receipt have increased from 26 percent to 50 percent during the same period.

"In too many instances in the past the farmer has been left holding the bag for unpaid fruits and vegetables," Eckel said.

Bankruptcies among produce

buyers have also increased in recent years. "In such cases," Eckel said, "the seller has no way of recapturing money owed because the court takes control of all assets which are distributed to creditors such as banks and lending institutions first. The total cost of such bankruptcies and bad business practices is at least \$64 million annually."
Eckel adda! "It's evident fruit

and vegetable producers have needed additional protection for the last several years. The unwritten traditional 'trust relationship' between sellers and buyers has been broken with increasing frequency. We urge President Reagan to quickly enact this reform so that there farmers are spared any further financial

Carpenter also outlined specific proposals for the 1985 Farm Bill. There is no recovery yet for far-

mers, he said, citing falling land and used equipment prices and farm product prices that continue to be far below the cost of production.


Specifically, Carpenter made the following recommendations for the 1985 Farm Bill:

Adequate loan rates (or purchase prices) related to the cost of production;

A reserve program with entry aufficient to attract the

needed quantity and release levels sufficiently high so as not to unduly depress market values;

And the authority for land diversion programs, both longterm to remove fragile or lessproductive land from production, and short-term for adjustments to effect immediate changes in effective domestic or foreign demand for specific agricultural commodities.
