Cattle - Light salable numbers (29 pct. below last week) offset the effects of a declining beef trade as fed prices held steady for the week. Most buying interests operated cautiously in light of poor profit margins, but were unable to lower the price levels on the diminished receipts. Overall finish ran on the mediocre side and mud still a problem. Slaughter Cows 1.00-2.00 lower. Slaughter Bulls steady to 1.00 lower.

Estimated 4 day receipts (Friday holiday) 8000, actuals last week 11714 and last year 14908. Steers comprised 42 pct of the week's receipts, Heifers 39 pct., cows 10 pct., feeders 8 pct.
