

## Cairns awarded SE scholarship

WEST CHESTER — The Board of Directors of the Southeast Farm Credit Associations takes great pleasure in announcing that Donald W. Cairns has been selected as the recipient of its 1984 scholarship of \$500.

Don is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert A. Cairns, Sr. of Parkesburg. He is a senior at Coatesville Area Senior High and will enter Penn State in the fall. He intends to major in Ag Production.

Don has a long list of achievements, both academic and extra-curricular. An Honor Society member, Don is also President of the Spanish Club and President of the Bel Canto Choir. A member of the Meistersingers, District Chorus, Regional Chorus, and Scott Singers, Don is also a

member of the Upper Octorara United Presbyterian Church Choir where he shares his musical talents as a soloist. In 1982, Don received the Outstanding Music Service Award and the Best Supporting Actor — he is also a member of the Scott Drama Club.

Don's agricultural accomplishments are equally impressive. He is a member of the Chester County 4-H Baby Beef Club in which he has held many offices, including that of president. He was also named Outstanding Teen Leader (1981-82) in the Club. In 1982, he was a member of the Chester County Senior Livestock Judging Team which went on to become the State Judging Team. It represented Pennsylvania at the Nationals in Louisville, Ky where

the team finished the competition as National Champions in Beef Cattle Judging. Don was named top individual in the nation in Beef Cattle Judging. Due to a national rule which prohibits an individual from entering the same contest once on a state winning team, Don is ineligible to compete now. However, he is coaching the new county "mini" livestock judging team which is comprised of 8-12-year-olds.

Don, whose parents raise Angus cattle, was also Champion Intermediate Showman at the Southeast Pennsylvania District Beef Show, finished in 2nd place in the State Angus Showmanship Contest, was Honorable Mention National Angus Showman, and, in 1981 and 1983, was 6th place finisher in the State 4-H Meat Evaluation Contest.

## Kuhn cites larger Gyrorake

VERNON, N.Y. — The need for gentle raking action and the advantage of side delivery are highlighted with a new larger size Kuhn Gyrorake.

Known as the Model GA 402, this twin rotor gyrorake has a gentle side delivery action that guards against leaf loss, roping, or stone collecting — common windrowing problems. At the same time its heavy duty 7-tine-arms-per-rotor ensure strong, dependable raking even in heavy grass or legume crops.

This gyrorake's effective working width of 13 feet is expandable to 23 feet with double windrowing — a practice that provides ideal windrows for large capacity round balers.

Tines and tine arms are controlled by centrally mounted cams with all moving parts completely enclosed in greased rotor housings

to ensure minimum wear.

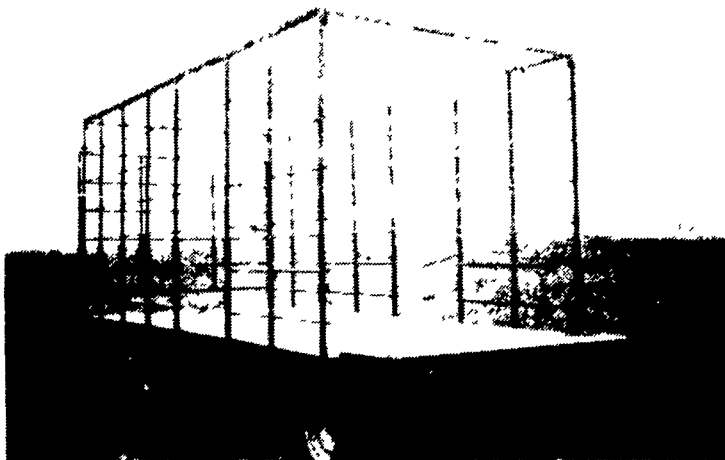
Large support wheels give the unit solid support on rough ground and can be raised or lowered to give correct working height. Articulation of the 3-point frame provides optimum mobility while working, and maneuverability when locked into a transport position.

The GA 402 Gyrorake complements the rest of the Kuhn line which includes smaller models with working widths ranging from 7½ feet to nearly 10 feet. Major warehousing in the Northeast and Southwest services dealers throughout the United States and Canada.

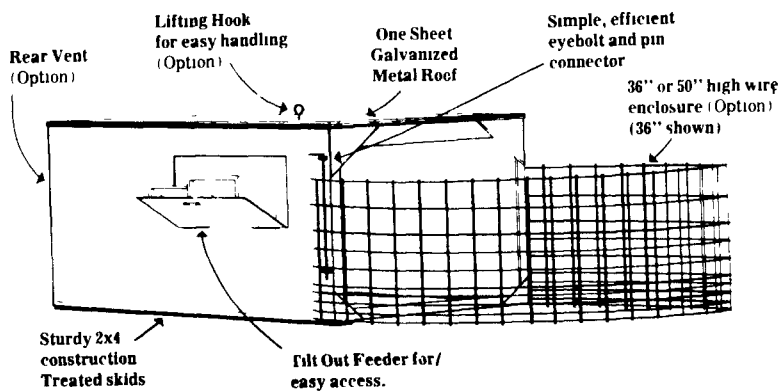

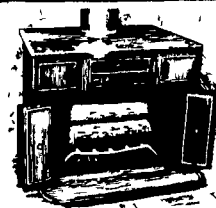
