## Chevron to realign Ortho unit

Located adjacent to Ortho's existing environmental protection research laboratories, the new scientific complex will include chemical and biotechnical laboratories, office facilities and a library to support 350 researchers and technicians.

Dr. H.J. Aroyan, Director-Research, will continue to direct Ortho's R&D activities. Now reporting to him will be: Dr. L.R. Griffith, Manager-Inventive Research; C.R. Tanner, Manager-Development Research; and Dr. R.D. Wessel, Manager-Projects & Acquisitions.
