Market Comment: Movement on ready to cook whole birds is fair to occasionally good, but overall demand is disappointing. Clearances are fair but the availability of 3 lb. and over sizes continue to be a drag on the market. The movement on parts is only fair; cutlets, breasts and legs are adequate while leg quarters and wings are fully adequate to ample.

Live supplies are at least adequate and weights overall are heavy. Undertone mixed.


