"I'm excited about the opportunity to serve young people in this capacity," said Case. Case cites vocational agriculture enrollment trends and the need to show the public how well vo-ag programs are preparing students for agricultural careers as areas he plans to study and act upon.

The nationwide search that ended in the selection of Case was made with the advice and counsel of representatives of vo-ag teachers, state supervisors of agricultural education, teacher educators and the Agricultural Division of the American Vocational Association (AVA).
