Darcy Jo Feeser, 16, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Feeser, Hanover R6. She is a junior at South Western High School and plans to attend college following graduation. Active in her church's youth group and school

events, Darcy is a member of the band, and track team and participates in various musical productions.

Three cows and three calves in the family's registered Holstein herd are Darcy's through 4-H. She belongs to both the community and Central dairy club.
