Youth Forestry Camp 1984 is now accepting applications from boys and girls 14 to 17 years of age. Each of the four three-day sessions will provide valuable hands-on experience for young people considering forestry or forest-related careers. Sessions will take place at:

McKeever Environment Education Center (Mercer County) - July 17-19

Stone Valley Civil Engineering Camp (Huntingdon County) - July 24-26

American Youth Hostel (Cumberland County) - August 7-9

Pocono Environmental Education Center (Pike County) - August 14-16

Instructors are from Penn State's School of Forest Resources, the Pennsylvania Forestry Association, the U.S. Forest Service, forest industries, and public utility companies. Each instructor will work with a small

group of young people to explore the forest ecosystem. They will learn how trees grow, how to identify them, and how they are harvested and converted to products used daily.

"Why" as well as "How" will be a focus of activities. Objectives of forest management will be discussed and multiple use of forest resources will be explored. Field trips to sawmills and logging sites will be combined with field work and discussions as well as a bit of forest recreation.
