Champaign, Dr. Milburn com-pleted a B.S. program in Veterinary Medicine as well as a D.V.M.



# Small farm handbook available

NEWARK, Del. - Farmers with a small livestock enterprise, and people getting into farming in a small way, can benefit from a new handbook published by the Northeast Regional Agricultural Engineering Service.

"The 88-page handbook is called Small Farms - Livestock Buildings and Equipment, and it can help you plan, design and construct facilities for livestock," says University of Delaware extension agricultural engineer Jim Scar-borough. "It can also help you adapt or modify existing buildings on your farm.'

The handbook includes guidelines for basic farmstead planning, site selection and space planning. A livestock chapter gives housing requirements for swine, beef, dairy cattle, goats, horses, sheep, poultry and rabbits. To reduce production costs, enclosed housing using natural ventilation is emphasized. The

sections on swine, dairy and poultry also tell how to provide warm housing for birthing, nursing and raising your livestock.

One chapter covers materials and construction techniques including remodeling of old barns. Lumber selection, roofing, siding, and concrete work for a new barn are also discussed.


Other chapters cover such important topics as utilities, ventilation and environmental controls, waste and pest management, and fencing. A separate 30-page section contains plans for do-ityourself fencing, housing, feeding, and other structures.




**Truss Design For Mim Truss Height At Center Line Trusses Are More Economical**
