


Market Comment: Movement on ready to cook whole birds is fair at best with most processors indicating disappointment in today's damand. Parts are moving better man whole birds, but here again the demand is not that aggressive, and interest centers on leg quarters and wings. Today's LTL asking prices are unchanged on U.S. Grade A at 58 to 63 cents, but additional product is still being discounted in several quarters.

Slaughter is moderate as an occasional plant is not operating today. Live supplies are adequate at improving but still irregular weights. Undertone steady.
