Scholars visit ag

UNIVERSITY PARK -Questions about biology, chemistry, mathematics and computers were the order of the day at recent meetings in the College of Agriculture.

It was the tenth annual Penn State Scholars Program sponsored by the Office of Undergraduate Admissions Office at Penn State's University Park Campus. Several hundred high school juniors were invited to visit the colleges of their choice and many chose agriculture.

The program is designed to introduce Penn State to students of high academic achievement who are in the process of deciding which colleges and universities to attend. In addition to visiting one of Penn State's ten colleges, students toured the campus, met college students and generally had a preview orientation of what college life might be like.

"This is a great program, said Dr. James McCoy, coordinator of student recruitment for the College of Agriculture. We had a full house

of students and their parents who came to ask questions about the college and about matching our programs with their interests. They wanted to know about job prospects in agriculture, which, on the whole, are good. The United States Department of Agriculture estimates that there will be a 13 percent annual shortfall of qualified graduates to fill agricultural jobs through the nineteen nineties," he commented.

According to McCoy, students asked about programs in plant science and animal bioscience. They wanted advice on how to prepare for graduate school in veterinary medicine and some

were curious about programs in agricultural engineering which is offered jointly with the College of Engineering.

"It's terribly important for college-bound high school students to talk to faculty at colleges and universities they visit. They have a big decision ahead of them and they need to make it with as much understanding as possible,

continued McCoy.

The summer between the junior and senior years is an ideal time to visit colleges, said McCoy. Most colleges and universities, including Penn State and the College Agriculture, have ongoing visiting programs to help prospective students make their
