A special ceremony will be held at 2 p.m., Saturday, to highlight

the day's events. Making guest mile ride on the Erie Canal appearances will be Major Carl J. Eilenberg of Rome and New York State Dairy Princess Patricia Patterson.

The event will continue through tomorrow, June 10, with free cheese, door prizes and children's games. The admission price for adults is \$5.50, Children \$3.50 (7-14), under 7, - free. This will enable visitors to tour the Village's historical exhibits, buildings and museums. It also includes a 21/2

packett-boat and a 4-mile train ride on the "Rome and Fort Bull Railroad."
